

# Round Granny in a Square Motif

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US CROCHET TERMINOLOGY



## Tools & Materials

Suggested yarn thicknesses and corresponding hook sizes:

4ply/Fingering weight yarn - 3 mm/D.

DK/Sport weight yarn - 4mm/G.

Worsted/Aran weight yarn - 5mm/H.

### Sample motif:

I have used a 4ply yarn with a 3 mm/D hook.

### Yardage per square:

In total, I have used 10g/36m/39yds

### Finished dimensions:

Using 3mm hook & 4ply yarn, after blocking – 10cm/ 4” x 10cm/ 4”

Finished size & yardage will vary depending on hook size, yarn thickness & your personal gauge.

## Key

**beg** - beginning

**ch** – chain

**dc** – double crochet

**hdc** – half double crochet

**esc** – extended single crochet

**prev** - previous

**sk** – skip

**rnd(s)** – round(s)

**sl st** – slip st

**st(s)** – stitch(es)

**tr** – treble crochet

## Supplies

**Multicoloured yarn:** 4ply Sock Yarn by [Lottie Knits](#).

### A note about colour placement:

In the instructions, for the rainbow motif I have used 6 colours - A, B, C, D, E, F.

For the motifs in the cover shot, each motif uses 4 colours in the following sequence A, B, C, D, A, B.

## Instructions

**Round 1:** *With Colour A*, ch4 & join to form a ring; ch3 (counts as first dc in this and all subsequent rnds), 2dc in ring; (ch2, 3dc in ring) 3 times; ch2 & join with sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch3; fasten off.



**Round 2:** *With Colour B*, join yarn in any ch2 corner space, *except* the start/end of prev rnd, ch3, in same corner sp - 2dc, ch1; (in next corner sp - 3dc, ch1, 3d, ch1) 3 times; in beg corner sp, 3dc, ch1 & join with sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch3; fasten off.



**Round 3:** *With Colour C*, join yarn in next ch1 space *after* the start/end of prev rnd, ch3, in same sp – 2dc, ch1, 3dc, ch1; (in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1; in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1, 3d, ch1) 3 times in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1; join with sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch3; fasten off.



**Round 4:** *With Colour D*, join yarn in next ch1 space *after* the start/end of prev rnd, ch3, in same sp – 2dc, ch1; in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1; [in 2<sup>nd</sup> dc of next 3dc cluster - 3dc, ch1; (in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1) 3 times] 3 times; in 2<sup>nd</sup> dc of next 3dc cluster - 3dc, ch1; in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1; join with sl st to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch3; fasten off.



**Round 5:** *With Colour E*, join yarn in any ch1 space *except* the start/end of prev rnd, ch3, in same sp – 2dc, ch1; (in next ch1 sp – 3dc, ch1) 15 times; join with sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg ch3; fasten off.

**Note:** *at this point your motif may be bowling up or curling – have no fear, the next round will sort this out.*



**Round 6:** *With Colour F*, and **working into the back loops only** for the whole round, join yarn in middle (2<sup>nd</sup> dc) of 3dc cluster that's in line with the middle of the 3dc cluster from Round 1 (see image); sc in same st; 1sc in each of next 3 sts; (2sc in next st; 1sc in each of next 7sts) 7 times; 2sc in next st; 1sc into each of the rem 3sts; join with sl st into 1<sup>st</sup> sc; DO NOT FASTEN OFF



**Round 7:** ch4 (counts as tr), and going back to **working through both loops** throughout, make 2 tr in same st, ch2, in same st make 2 more tr (1<sup>st</sup> corner made); (in next st 2tr; 1dc into each of next 2 sts; 1hdc; 1esc into each of the next 2sts; 1sc into each of the next 5sts; 1esc into each of the next 2sts; 1hdc; 1dc into each of next 2 sts; in next st 2tr; in next st make corner – 2tr, ch2, 2tr) 3 times; in next st 2tr; 1dc into each of next 2 sts; 1hdc; 1esc into each of the next 2sts; 1sc into each of the next 5sts; 1esc into each of the next 2sts; 1hdc; 1dc into each of next 2 sts; in next st 2tr; join round with a sewn bind off in 1<sup>st</sup> tr.



**And this is what it looks like washed, blocked & dried!**



**Joining this motif**

You can join these motifs in many ways:

1. by sewing them together with a simple whip stitch.
2. sewing together with a mattress stitch (video here <https://youtu.be/YjzHkc2AGnY>).
3. crochet the motifs together with slip stitch or single crochet.
4. Join as you go in the final round using the drop loop technique.
